At the end of each year, our HOEP team, with the educators and parents, stand in absolute gratitude when we see how the children have grown on every level... how ready and confident they are to enter their Grade 1 year. Our hearts also beat warmly in the wonderful knowing that each one of these young learners had the opportunity to hear the Word of God.


10 Years have passed since HOEP first launched its early remedial intervention in 2014, and more than 14 000 learners have meanwhile completed the program! HOEP's footprint has grown from where we started at one school in Sir Lowry's Pass to where we now serve 108 crèches. From Sir Lowry's Pass, HOEP's intervention expanded to Strand, Firgrove, Grabouw, Franschhoek, Macassar, Raithby, Khayelitsha, Harare, Mitchell's Plain, Delft, Kuilsrivier, Mfuleni, Eersterivier, Lwandle, Asanda Village, Klapmuts and Botrivier. Since printing of our remedial workbooks first started in 2017, 53 276 workbooks have already been printed and distributed!

Preparing for "big school!"







Above and below (From left to right): This year we have again started at full speed with the development of perceptual skills. The learners did threading activities, their finger muscles were strengthened in various ways, they practised to sort, to cut, to copy, they learned about shapes and colours and much, much more!







<u>Below</u>: Also regarding mathematical development, hard work was done! Number formation and number recognition at HOEP is much more than just the forming and naming of a 0, a 1 or a 2... the learners feel the numbers on sandpaper, they build the numbers with clay, they paint them with water on a wall, they count the numbers with blocks, they sing it, they rhyme it, they enjoy it! Learning about mathematical concepts such as full and empty, more and less etc., is also transformed into practical discovery sessions.







<u>Below</u>: The last step is working in the workbooks! The skills have already been practised so thoroughly on concrete level that the learners easily move on to completing similar assignments in their workbooks.







Crafts for Kingdom Kids



<u>Left</u>: Our trial books are already in our hands! The last round of proofreading is now ahead, before HOEP will officially have a book with a very special purpose on the shelves!

"Crafts for Kingdom Kids" will be available in English and in Afrikaans (Kuns vir Koningskleuters) and was written with the aim of stimulating creativity, awakening the scientist inside every young learner, and laying solid foundations. Learning becomes a real adventure through this book!







The content of "Crafts for Kingdom Kids" is already being shared with the educators by the HOEP team. <u>Above</u> it can be seen how the learners made mirrors and decorated them with their fingerprints. Learners also studied their fingerprints under a magnifying glass. After this lesson, every child realised how special God made him or her.

<u>Left</u>: Sunglasses with a special message: "God looks at me with eyes full of grace and love!".

<u>Below</u>: We did marble painting to make the most beautiful hearts. The artworks were sent home with the precious message: "God knows my heart".

<u>Above: left and middle</u>: Educators who present the program in their classes are guided weekly by our team of quality co-ordinators. The educators not only learn new perceptual skills themselves, they also learn WHY those particular skills are important for the learners in their classes and how they can improvise if they do not have certain resources at their disposal for developing the skills.

<u>Above, right:</u> Quality control is of great importance to us. Our operations manager visits the crèches throughout the year to make sure that the program is implemented correctly. Each educator receives a motivating, uplifting report after such a class visit.

<u>Below</u>: We experience how, year after year, the educators become more and more skilled in presenting our remedial program and how they integrate it more and more effectively with the base programs they use. They dramatise, incorporate technology where possible and they really make learning an unforgettable experience for the learners! 
Visitors from America


Since 2023, HOEP has also contributed by bringing our remedial program to VenSel.

Zebbie in the Cape Flats!








