

## **Achievement of goals**



Our HOEP-team is on the home stretch, running to cross the finish line with 2,662 young learners and their educators! To God be the glory for a wonderful 2024-race.

## 168 Educators were empowered

<u>Bottom</u>: Educators across the Western Cape passionately teaching and applying their knowledge!



Our team of six quality coordinators (see photo of the HOEP-team on page 11), took each educator by the hand and guided them on a weekly basis to confidently present the remedial intervention work for the following week in their own classes. A huge amount of empowerment occurred weekly in this way.

# 2,662 Young learners from 106 early childhood development centres and schools received quality remedial intervention this year

<u>Bottom</u>: Learners enjoy the different perceptual activities and learn to work on concrete, semi-abstract and abstract levels. It is wonderful to see how the learners grow and get ready to prosper in their grade 1 year!



<u>Bottom</u>: Mathematical activities were once again presented in fun ways. During the learning of mathematical concepts such as heaviest/lightest, the parents were also involved to help with making scales!



<u>Bottom left</u>: It is heartwarming to see how the educators stimulate higher-level mathematical thinking in the learners by guiding them to calculate answers to questions

such as: "I have 3 lions in one game camp. How many wild animals should I put in the other camp to have 7 animals in total?"

<u>Bottom right</u>: The grade R learners also excelled in the 12 high frequency sounds introduced to them. A solid foundation for future reading and writing was established.

The learners were inquisitive about the objects on these tables and the theme discussions led to interesting journeys of discovery!

## Monitoring

Class visits were conducted throughout the year and were followed by complete, uplifting reports to the educators who were visited.

#### Assessment

Our internal assessment data of each learner on the program was punctually kept up to date and by term 3 and 4 it provided a clear indication of which learners still presented backlogs. We were able to guide the educators to provide additional assistance to those learners.

Cooperation with the Department of Education is also starting to become an achievable goal, as the first step has already been taken by HOEP! We are currently joining hands with the Department in the Overberg District to timeously provide the names of the learners with learning barriers in the Botrivier and Grabouw areas to Valenzia MacKenzie (Educational specialist and therapy coordinator). Valenzia and her team then make sure that those learners immediately receive help (in the form of occupational therapy or speech therapy) in grade 1. Exemption from school for the following year is also arranged by her team in specific cases. In this way, HOEP helps to cast a net under these learners, so that they can be identified in time and receive assistance immediately when starting their formal school careers.

#### **Geographical areas of impact**

HOEP's footprint has grown enormously, and impact is currently being made in the following 17 geographical areas in the Western Cape: Strand, Lwandle, Asanda Village, Sir Lowry's Pass, Grabouw, Botrivier, Franschhoek, Klapmuts, Raithby, Firgrove, Macassar, Eersterivier, Mfuleni, Kuils River, Delft, Khayelitsha and Mitchell's Plain.

## Crafts for Kingdom Kids
